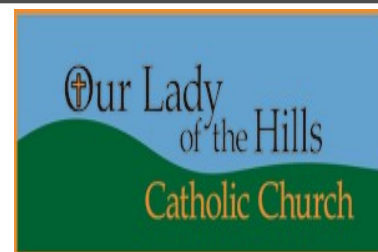

## What are the beliefs of the Assemblies of God?

It's the largest Pentecostal denomination in the U.S. and the fastest growing religious group in the world with some 16 million members worldwide. It was started in 1914 by a group of Evangelicals who came out of the Pentecostal movement. The Assemblies of God is fundamentalist in its approach to the Bible, distinguished by its Pentecostal beliefs. Many of the arguments used by "mainstream" Fundamentalists against Catholicism are employed also by members of the Assemblies of God. The members believe in the pretribulational rapture and a millennial kingdom on Earth. In some ways, the Assemblies of God is really just a Pentecostalized version of the Baptist faith. For instance, it observes only two ordinances: the Lord's Supper or Holy Communion, which is interpreted as a mere memorial of Christ's death, and baptism. There is no infant baptism. Water baptism by adults is regarded as little more than a public declaration of one's commitment to Christ. Assemblies of God stresses the charismatic gifts mentioned by Paul in 1 Corinthians 12:4-11 (gifts of prophecy, speaking in tongues, miraculous healing). They believe that these spiritual gifts should be in full operation in the life of the Church. Local congregations are independent. Each congregation hires and fires its own pastors and oversees its own affairs. At the same time, the general interests of the denomination are addressed in their top legislative body, the General Council, or by the General Presbytery when the Council is not in session. Television evangelists like Jim Bakker and Jimmy Swaggart were Assemblies of God ministers before being defrocked.

You may drop your Mass intention envelope in the collection basket or send it to the office. If the date you request is unavailable, your intention will be scheduled for the next open date available unless you request otherwise.

In accordance with the guidelines from the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston, Mass stipends are deposited in a separate checking account. If you are writing a check, please make it payable to **St. Anthony Mass Account**.

The current suggested level of giving is \$20 for a weekend Mass or \$10 for a daily Mass. Any offering, however, is most welcome, and, if you do not have funds to offer, you are encouraged to request your Mass intention.

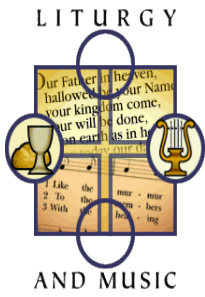

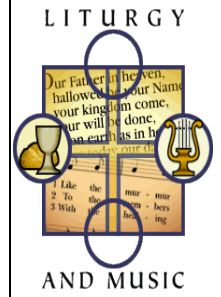

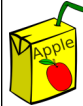


### Congratulations
