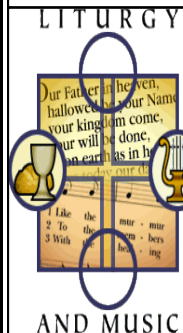

Why Are You Afraid?

Meditation: How can we fight fear with faith? Jesus' sleeping presence on the storm-tossed sea reveals the sleeping faith of his disciples. They feared for their lives even though their Lord and Master was with them in the boat. They were asleep to Christ while he was present to them in their hour of need. The Lord Jesus is ever present to us. And in our time of testing he asks the same question: *Why are you afraid? Have you no faith?* Do you recognize the Lord's presence with you, especially when you meet the storms of adversity, sorrow, and temptation? Whenever we encounter trouble, the Lord is there with the same reassuring message: *"It is I, do not be afraid."*

Faith must be nourished with the Word of God

What are the characteristics of faith and how can we grow in it? Faith is an entirely free gift that God makes to us. Believing is only possible by grace and the help of the Holy Spirit, who moves the heart and who opens the eyes of the mind to understand and accept the truth which God has revealed to us. Faith enables us to relate to God rightly and confidently, with trust and reliance, by believing and adhering to his word, because he is utterly reliable and trustworthy. If we want to live, grow, and persevere in faith, then it must be nourished with the word of God.

Christ's love and truth strengthen us in faith and trust

Fear does not need to cripple us from taking right action or rob us of our trust and reliance on God. Courage working with faith enables us to embrace God's word of truth and love with confidence and to act on it with firm hope in God's promises. The love of God strengthens us in our faith and trust in him and enables us to act with justice and kindness towards our neighbor even in the face of opposition or harm. Do you allow the love of Christ to rule in your heart and mind, and to move your will to choose what is good in accordance with his will?

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A message from Deacon David Wuletich:

What is Mass?

The Mass is the re-presentation and renewal of the Christ's Sacrifice of the Cross on Calvary, hence it is most properly referred to as the "Holy Sacrifice of the Mass". The Mass is the divinely ordained means of applying the graces of Calvary to all generations. In the Mass, we receive the Holy Eucharist, Christ's Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

Why do we sing the Mass?

We chant at Mass because singing is a higher form of speaking. Singing requires more effort than speaking. At Mass, we offer ourselves to God the Father through Christ. It is a "sacrifice of praise." Therefore, to offer the highest sacrifice, we give ourselves completely. Singing is one way we offer ourselves in a higher manner that conveys both beauty and effort.

Why do we use some Greek, Latin and Hebrew in the Mass?

In the earliest centuries of the Church, the Mass was prayed in Greek. Preserving the Greek Kyrie today among the prayers of the Mass is an important reminder to us of our unique and rich heritage as Catholics — it connects us and draws us closer to those earliest Christians who daily pronounced with fervor and devotion those most powerful words. We sing some parts of the Mass in Latin because Latin is now the universal language of the Church. Singing in Latin fosters unity, maintains a sense of mystery, and fosters a sense of religious heritage. It unites in worship different nationalities, cultures, and individuals. We sing in Hebrew "Amen" and "Alleluia" connecting us to the Church's Jewish origins.
