From the Pastor's Desk

Almsgiving

During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "almsgiving," which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 2462). As we continue our journey through Lent, we are reminded of our responsibility to share what we have (wealth, gifts, and talents) with the less fortunate. Through the

parable of the rich man and poor Lazarus, Jesus warns that there will be a reversal of fortunes at the end.

Charitable giving is an ancient practice that is customary in many cultures and religions. As Christians, we are called to follow in the example of Christ who showed great compassion to those on the fringes of society. Even if we do not see them, the poor have always been among us and so has the call to support them. The Catechism states that charity is "the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God" (CCC, No. 1822).

We witness those around us who do not have enough – food, clothing, or shelter. Those with the resources can choose to share from their surplus – by making a donation or sharing the resources needed (e.g. cans of soup or dry goods to the food pantry). Clearing out one's pantry and donating surplus food to the food pantry; or clearing out one's closet and donating unused clothing to the charity organizations are wonderful ways to observe Lent through almsgiving. It is good to reflect on the words of Jesus at the last Judgement, "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me"(MT 25/40). His Holiness Pope Francis tells us, "During this Lent, may we practice almsgiving by giving joyfully (2 Corinthians 9:7). God who 'supplies seed to the Sower and bread for food' (2 Corinthians 9:10) enables each of us not only to have food to eat, but also to be generous in doing good to others. While it is true that we have our entire life to sow goodness, let us take special advantage of this Lenten season to care for those close to us and to reach out to our brothers and sisters who lie wounded along the path of life" (Luke 10:25-37). — <u>Pope Francis, 2022 Lenten Message</u>

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

As requested by Bishop Brennan, we will resume distribution of the Sacred Cup to the faithful on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) are mandated by the bishop for a period of 3 years. Since the Sacred Cup has not been distributed from the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic 3 years ago, Bishop Brennan is taking this opportunity to renew the process of EMHC's training and certification. Father Thomas will hold two sessions to review instructions for all former and new volunteers to this ministry. At St. Anthony, the review will be held after the 10:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday, March 19. At Our Lady of the Hills, the review will be after the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday, March 26. You are asked to please prayerfully consider renewing or volunteering to serve as a EMHC.

Jesus Frees Us from Spiritual Blindness and Sin

Meditation: Do you recognize the light of God's truth and power in your life? God wants to remove every obstacle that might hinder us from recognizing the light of his truth and wisdom for our lives. Saul, the first king of Israel, failed to recognize God's light and power to save him from his enemies. God replaced Saul with David, the youngest of Jesse's eight sons (1 Samuel 16). God saw something in David which Jesse and his other sons did not recognize - a man after God's own heart who delighted in doing what was pleasing to the Lord (1 Samuel 13:14). David was a man of courage and vision who defeated his enemies and united his people. His strength and success came not from himself but from God who anointed him with the power and wisdom of his own Spirit.

What can keep us from the light of God's truth, wisdom, and strength for our lives? Sin blinds us and causes us to stumble and fall - unable to rise on our own or to walk in the freedom of God's love and truth. Sin clouds the mind in moral confusion, and it grows in darkness and resists the light of God's truth. Only God's light can uncover the darkness of sin and free us to walk in the path of holiness and peace with God.

The Lord Jesus is ever ready to heal us and to free us from the darkness of sin and deception. There is no sickness, whether physical, mental, emotional, or spiritual that the Lord Jesus does not identify with. Isaiah prophesied that the "Suffering Servant" would be bruised for our iniquities and by his stripes we would be healed (Isaiah 53:5). The Lord offers us freedom from spiritual blindness due to sin and he restores us to wholeness of body, mind, soul, and heart. Augustine of Hippo, in his commentary on this Gospel passage, remarks: "If we reflect on the meaning of this miracle, we will see that the blind man is the human race ...You already know, of course, who the "One Sent" is.
