From the Pastor's Desk

5 Precepts of the Church

St. Thomas Aquinas defined law as "a command of reason promulgated by a competent authority for the common good." Governments, clubs, organizations, families, and religions have laws for the common good of their members. It is to protect its members from possible abuse or neglect as well as to preserve the unity and integrity of the group. Church is considered the family of God and rules exist to protect that family as a whole as well as the individual members. Catholics are obliged to

follow all the divine laws, natural laws, civil and church (canon) laws. Catholics are to follow all the legitimate and ethical civil laws as long as they don't contradict the laws of God and the church. In short, we are law abiding citizens. Remember the words of Jesus, "render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's" (Mk 12/17).

Catholic Church has a code of canon law promulgated in 1983. Church is ruled by these laws. Besides canon law, there are five precepts, the church's house rules, for the spiritual well being of its members. Just as school children must at least attend school daily in order to remain in school and employees must show up for work each day to keep their paychecks coming, so too, Catholics must do the minimum by following these five precepts. These precepts are binding only on Catholics. To be a good, practicing catholic means believing what the church teaches and obeying these rules:

- 1. Attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
- 2. Receive the Holy Eucharist at least during Easter season.
- 3. Confess your sins at least once a year.
- 4. Fast and abstain on appointed days.
- 5. Contribute to the support of the Church.

Letus Pray.

show me how to give generously,

pray purposefully, and serve joyfully

for a purpose greater than myself.

Use me God,

Amen.

The Church uses these precepts to remind us that Christian life requires a commitment to prayer and active participation in the liturgy and sacraments. If we fall below this bare-minimum level, we can't rightly consider ourselves to be in full communion with the Catholic Church.

Each of these precepts of the Catholic Church is a requirement. Together with the ten commandments, they represent the minimum level of moral living. Intentional violation of the precepts or the Commandments is a grave sin. Always remember: the precepts of the Catholic Church are minimum levels of participation in the life of the Church. Out of love for Christ and a desire to advance in the spiritual life, you will normally try to do far more than they require.

Ask and You Will Receive from Your Father in Heaven

Meditation: Do you expect God to hear your prayers? Esther's prayer on behalf of her people is a model for us (Esther 14). She prayed for help according to God's promise to be faithful to his people. God wants us to remember his promises and to count on his help when we pray.

Your Father in heaven gives good things to those who ask with expectant faith

Jesus wanted to raise the expectations of his disciples when he taught them how to pray. Jesus' parable of the father feeding his son illustrates the unthinkable! How could a loving father refuse to give his son what is good; or worse, to give him what is harmful? In conclusion Jesus makes a startling claim: How much more will the heavenly Father give what is good to those who ask!

Our heavenly Father graciously gives beyond our expectations. Jesus taught his disciples to pray with confidence because the heavenly Father in his goodness always answers prayers. That is why we can boldly pray: *Give us this day our daily bread*.

Allow God's love to purify your mind, heart, and speech

Prayer flows from the love of God; and the personal love we show to our neighbor is fueled by the love that God has poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5). Jesus concludes his discourse on prayer with the reminder that we must treat our neighbor in the same way we wish to be treated by God. We must not just avoid doing harm to our neighbor, we must actively seek his or her welfare. In doing so, we fulfill the scriptural teaching from the "law and the prophets," namely what God requires of us - loving God with all that we have and are and loving our neighbor as ourselves. The Holy Spirit is ever ready to change our hearts and transform our lives in Jesus' way of love and merciful kindness towards all. Do you thirst for holiness and for the fire of God's purifying love?
