

From the Pastor's Desk

“Do This in Memory of Me”

At the Last Supper, Jesus took bread and wine, declared them to be his Body and Blood, shared them with his disciples, and commissioned them to “do this in memory of me” (Lk 22:19, 1 Cor 11:24-25).

When we think of a memorial, we normally think of remembering an event or a person in terms of “calling them to mind.” Memorial plaques, statues, or services call to mind significant events in history and those who were involved in them. Pictures or other mementos of loved ones who have died or who live far away from us help us call them to mind. In this way, these activities are participated in or items are viewed “in memory” of the events or persons they commemorate.

The Holy Mass is a memorial, an *anamnesis*, of what Jesus did at the Last Supper, of his whole life and ministry and in a particular way of his sacrificial death on the cross. However, it is not a memorial in the same way as the examples just described above. The Holy Mass does more than call to mind the Paschal Mystery – the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ.

The semitic, biblical concept of memorial meant more than merely remembering something mentally or commemorating it symbolically. It meant making something from the past actually present once more. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains this as follows: “In the sense of Sacred Scripture, the *memorial* is not merely the recollection of past events, but the proclamation of the mighty works wrought by God for men. In the liturgical celebration of these events, they become in a certain way present and real. This is how Israel understands its liberation from Egypt: every time Passover is celebrated, the Exodus events are made present to the memory of believers so that they may

Mass Intention requests are scheduled in the order they are received.



conform their lives to them” (no. 1363).

In the New Testament, and in the time of the Church, the memorial takes on a new and deeper meaning. The Catechism explains, “When the Church celebrates the Eucharist, she commemorates Christ’s Passover, and it is made present: the sacrifice of Christ offered once for all on the Cross remains ever present” (no. 1364).

Mass is not a dramatic reenactment of the saving events in the life of Christ; rather, it is the re-presentation and the memorial of Christ’s sacrifice on the Cross. It is the memorial not simply because it calls it to mind, but because the liturgical celebration of the Eucharist makes this event truly present. Jesus says, “This *is* my Body and my Blood: Do this in remembrance of me,” affirming the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Take Heart—Your Sins Are Forgiven

Meditation: What cripples the mind and heart and stifles the healing power of love? Sin and unforgiveness for certain! Sin cripples us more than any physical ailment can. Sin is the work of the kingdom of darkness and it holds us in eternal bondage. There is only one solution and that is the healing, cleansing power of Jesus' forgiveness.

Power of forgiveness

Jesus' treatment of sinners upset the religious teachers of the day. When a cripple was brought to Jesus because of the faith of his friends, Jesus did the unthinkable. He first forgave the man his sins. The scribes regarded this as blasphemy because they understood that only God had authority to forgive sins and to unbind a man or woman from their burden of guilt. Jesus claimed an authority which only God could rightfully give. Jesus not only proved that his authority came from God, he showed the great power of God's redeeming love and mercy by healing the cripple of his physical ailment. This man had been crippled not only physically, but spiritually as well. Jesus freed him from his burden of guilt and restored his body as well.

Healing body, mind, and soul

The Lord Jesus is ever ready to bring us healing of mind, body, and soul. His grace brings us freedom from the power of sin and from bondage to harmful desires and addictions. Do you allow anything to keep you from Jesus' healing power?
