From the Pastor's Desk

The Sacrament of Confirmation

The Holy Spirit descended upon our Lord at his baptism, the sign that he was the MESSIAH and the Father's beloved Son. Christ later communicated this fullness of the spirit to the entire church on the day of Pentecost, fulfilling his promise that his followers would receive power when the Holy Spirit came upon them. After receiving this gift themselves, the apostles passed it on to others who came to believe the Gospel and were baptized.

How was the spirit imparted to the newly baptized? The Apostles "laid hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit" (Acts 8:17). This was the origin of the sacrament of confirmation which passes down to our own day. By receiving the sacrament of confirmation, a baptized person is equipped and strengthened to follow Jesus faithfully and to carry out the responsibilities of being a Christian. Confirmation continues and is a necessary completion of the mission of the Holy Spirit that was begun in Baptism, making the person able to assume greater responsibilities in love and service of God and of his people.

From the beginning, confirmation was a normal part of Christian initiation. Confirmation completes the graces received in baptism. In the Eastern Christian tradition, Chrismation (anointing with chrism) is always done immediately after baptism. In the Western Christian tradition, confirmation is always conferred by the bishop on the *confirmandi* after the age of discretion. The bishop, in the West, is the ordinary minister of confirmation, although sometimes the faculty of administering the sacrament of confirmation can be given to priests if the need arises.

To be confirmed, a person should be 1) in the state of grace, 2) have prepared spiritually for the sacrament by instruction, intense prayer, and the sacrament of penance, 3) have chosen a sponsor, often a godparent to support him/her spiritually, and 4) have chosen a name of a saint who is a special patron (continued on page 3)

Through the anointing, the one confirmed receives the mark or seal of the Holy Spirit. The seal signifies ownership. The seal of the Holy Spirit indicates that the person totally belongs to Christ and is enrolled in his service.

Fear Not - You Are of More Value Than Many Sparrows

Meditation: What does fear have to do with the kingdom of God? Fear is a powerful force. It can lead us to panic and flight or it can spur us to faith and action. The fear of God is the antidote to the fear of losing one's life. *I sought the Lord, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears. O fear the Lord, you his saints, for those who fear him have no want!* Come, O sons, listen to me, I will teach you the fear of the Lord. (Psalm 34:4,9,11)

Godly fear, reverence, and respect for God's ways produce wisdom and right judgment

What is godly fear? It is reverence for the One who made us in love and who sustains us in mercy and kindness. The greatest injury or loss which we can experience is not physical but spiritual - the loss of one's heart, mind, and soul to the power of hell. A healthy fear of God leads to spiritual maturity, wisdom and right judgment and it frees us from the tyranny of cowardly fear and sinful pride that refuses to do what is right, good, and just - especially in the face of opposition and evil. Do you trust in the power of God's love and truth that can conquer every fear and form of evil and wrongdoing? The Lord Jesus willingly embraced the cross for our sake to atone for our sins and to free us from slavery to sin, Satan, and death. Do you believe in the power of his cross and victory over death, despair, and sin?

Proclaim boldly what no earthly power can destroy - the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ

When Jesus proclaimed the kingdom of God he met opposition and hostility from those who refused to believe in him. He tells his disciples that they must expect the same treatment if they are to live and to proclaim the reign of God. There is both a warning and a privilege in his statement. Just as Jesus had to carry his cross, so the disciples must carry their cross and not try to evade it. To suffer for the faith is to share in the work of Christ. As one hymn states: *Lift high the Cross of Christ! Tread where his feet have trod*. The Holy Spirit gives us power and grace to live as disciples of Jesus Christ. Do you trust in God's grace to carry your cross for Jesus' sake?
